The Baltimore Screenwriters Competition is open to all screenwriters.		
Screenplays must be set in Baltimore or 75% filmable in Baltimore.		
Scripts must be written in US Motion Picture industry standard format and typed in 12pt. Courier font. -FEATURE FILM SCRIPTS: Approximately 85–150 pages -SHORT FILM SCRIPTS: Must not exceed 30 pages		
Email your Entry Form and an electronic copy of your script in .PDF format to: Debbie.Dorsey@baltimorecity.gov and Nikki.Powell@baltimorecity.gov.		
Entry fees will be paid electronically through Bill.com, either by ACH or Credit Card. Once entry form and proper information is received, you will receive a Bill.com email where you can pay your entry fee.		
To assure your script's anonymity through the judging process, please do not put your name or other identifying information (address, script registration number, etc.) on the title page or anywhere in your script.		
Submissions for the 2025 Competition will not be accepted after 11:59 p.m. ET on Wednesday, January 8, 2025.		
Scripts under option or sold are not eligible.		
Revisions and substitution of new drafts for entries received will not be accepted under any circumstances.		
Two or more authors may submit a screenplay as co-applicants. Division of the award will be the sole responsibility of the winners.		
More than one screenplay may be submitted by the same author(s). However, a separate completed and signed Entry Form and Entry Fee must accompany each submission. The screenplay submissions must be the original work of the applicant and may not be based, in whole or in part, on any other work for which the writer does not own the rights.		
We will not accept adaptations unless they comply with the above. Prizes are non-transferrable.		
The act of signing and submitting an Entry Form constitutes acceptance without reservation of all rules and requirements of the Baltimore Screenwriters Competition and all decisions rendered by its judges.
